

Help Katrina's Piano Fund Reach Its Goal

Since this time last year, our sound man, John "Klondike" Koehler, and his assistant, New Orleans musician, technician and survivor of Hurricane Katrina, Juan LaBostrie, have been rebuilding the lives of New Orleans area musicians by sending them instruments to replace those lost during the hurricane. This was done through Katrina's Piano Fund, a 501[c]3 non-profit organization which was set up last September.

Through the generosity of others and with resources of their own, Katrina's Piano Fund has now replaced all but two dozen instruments of the 300 applications they received.

This weekend, here at Rhythm and Roots, we hope to raise the money needed to fulfill the remaining requests — and to get even more lives back on track after the devastation wreaked by Hurricane Katrina last August.

We'll be hearing from Klondike firsthand about the good that has been done and the need that remains. We'll be passing the bucket through the Main Stage concert area. And you may also contribute in the boxes at our Information Booth and at our Tee Shirt Booth.
